To Ensure Your Safety and Security

What to do first

The City of Nagaoka established the Nagaoka City Evacuation Plan in Case of Nuclear Accidents based on the Nagaoka City Area Disaster Prevention Plan (Nuclear Disaster Countermeasures). This plan specifies the basic framework for distributing information regarding protective measures, evacuation shelters, arrangement of means of evacuation, etc. in case of nuclear accidents or probable nuclear accidents at the Kashiwazaki-Kariwa Nuclear Power Plant.

This booklet summarizes the things you should do and keep in mind when planning your evacuation. Please make sure you understand the contents of this booklet and stay calm by getting accurate information in case of an emergency.

First, take shelter indoors. 1

You are advised to take shelter indoors to protect yourself from the release of radioactive substances.

Taking shelter indoors is a protective measure to reduce radiation exposure levels.

Rushing to evacuate with your car or other means of transportation may cause traffic congestion, which may lead to a higher risk of disaster.

Remain indoors.

Evacuation should be conducted based on accurate information.

When evacuating, stay calm and do not rush. National guidelines suggest that evacuation be conducted within a week if radiation levels exceed 20 microsieverts per hour.

Evacuation will be conducted only for residents in areas with monitored radiation levels higher than the limit.



The national government and other authorities will monitor radiation levels. There is a high possibility that only residents of specific areas will be ordered to evacuate rather than all of the city's residents since the city covers such a large area stretching north to south. (see image below)

Operational Intervention Level (OIL) is a standard that determines when to start evacuation and other countermeasures. It can be found in The National Guidelines or Nuclear Disaster Countermeasures.

The above map was made by the City of Nagaoka based on the data from the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology and the U.S. Department of Energy issued on May 6, 2011 entitled "the Results of Aircraft Monitoring by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology and the U.S. Department of Energy (a radiation level monitoring map of the area in the 80-kilometer radius from Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant)." The above map highlights in gray the areas with an air radiation dose of 19 - 91 microsieverts per hour at the height of one meter above the ground (converted into current values as of April 29). The slashed area shows the region around the nuclear power plant where monitoring results have not been obtained.

Evacuating with your own car

- Evacuate by following the city's instructions.
- As a rule, you should use your own car to evacuate.
- In order to avoid traffic congestion, carpool as much as possible.

Evacuating by bus

• Residents who cannot evacuate with their own cars should evacuate by bus or other means of transportation

Help your neighbors as much as possible. Be aware of your neighbors and assist the elderly and people with special needs.

Local disaster prevention centers and other facilities are the designated meeting sites for evacuation by bus.



3 **Basic Locations of Designated Evacuation Shelters**

The Nuclear Safety Countermeasures Study Group, organized by all the municipalities of Niigata Prefecture, agreed upon the partnering municipalities for accepting evacuees from the area within a 30-kilometer radius from the Kashiwazaki-Kariwa Nuclear Power Plant.

Based on this agreement, the city had discussions with these municipalities and allocated the city's 40 communities to the accepting municipalities and designated evacuation routes to these places.

However, depending on the situation, locations of municipalities accepting evacuees may change.
